
# Reading

- Children are not permitted to use the school playground equipment after school.





# What your child needs everyday

- Please practise cutting food using knifes and forks with your child.



# Pupil Premium Funding

The school receives an additional £1,300 for your child if you are in receipt of any of the following benefits:

- · Income Support
- · Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- · Income-related Employment Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, (providing you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, payable at a higher rate than the family element, i.e. more than £547.50
- Working Tax Credit, Housing Benefit or Council Tax Support (not including second adult rebate)

Benefits in school include:

learning support in class one-to-one tuition,

subsidised swimming lessons cornet lessons (in Year 5)

end of term treats 50% reduction on the cost of trips

free milk (Reception to Year 2) 50% reduction on cost of school clubs.
