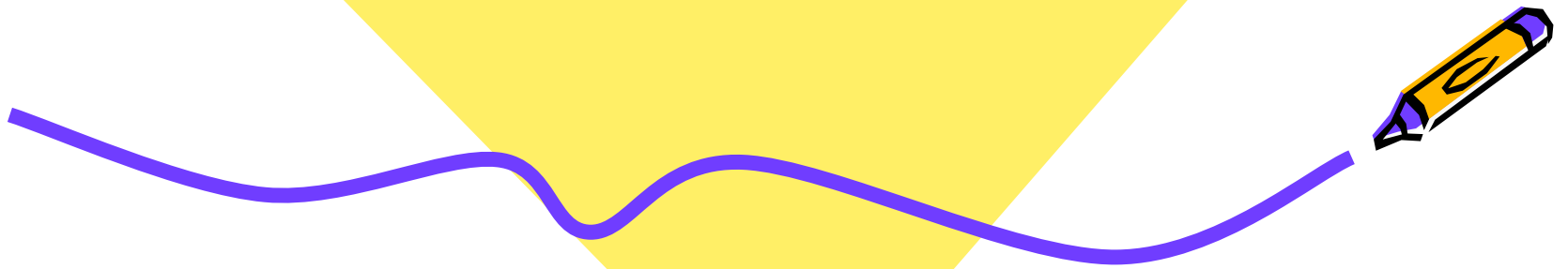


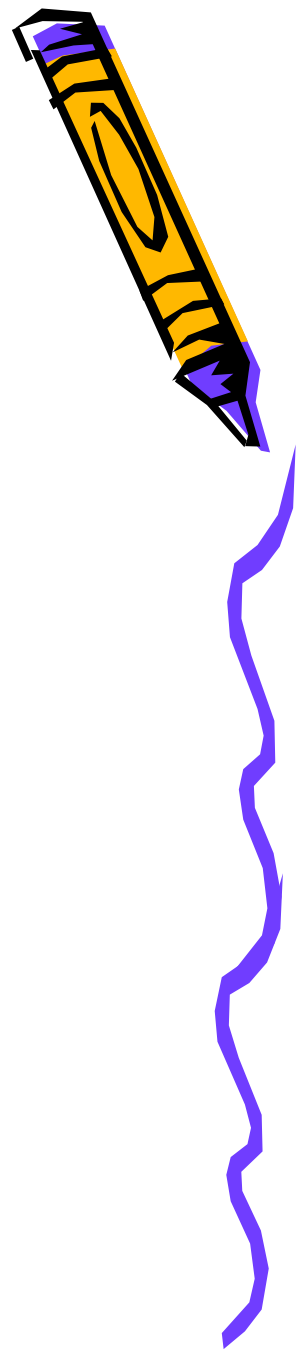

# Reading

- Your child will need to be able to read all these words before the next set is sent home.

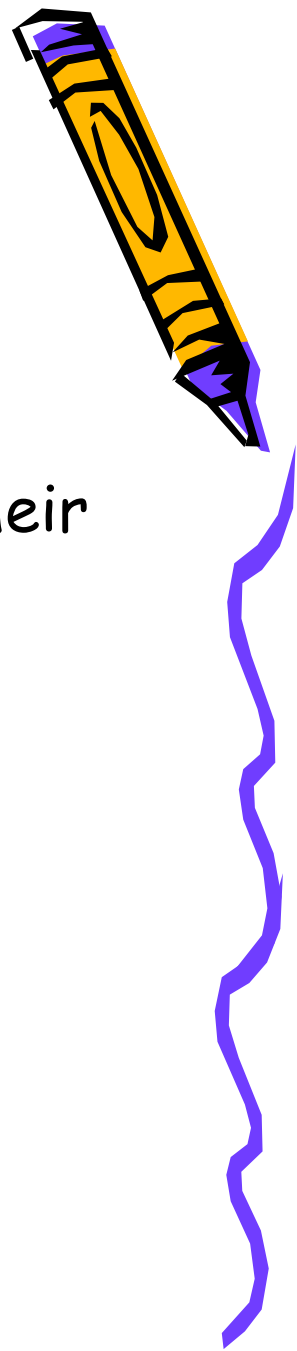


# HomeTime

# What your child needs everyday

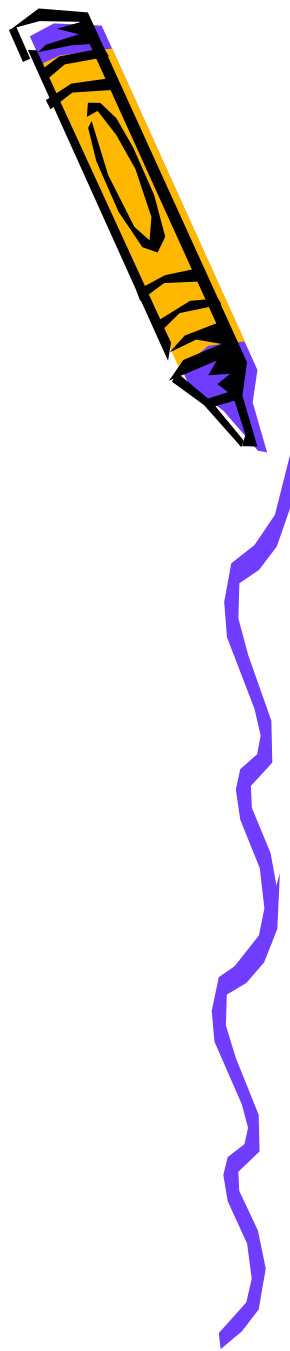


- Named Water bottle only containing water to keep in the classroom this is separate from their lunchbox drink and their milk for snack

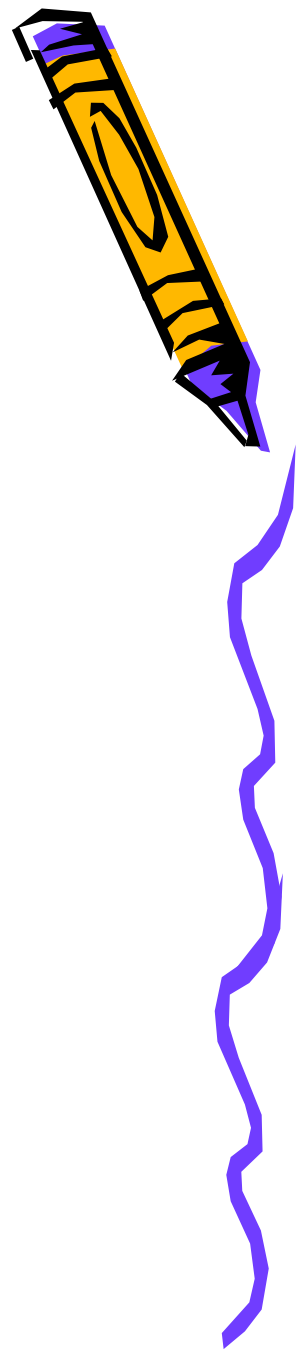

- Your child's key worker will be displayed on the classroom window.

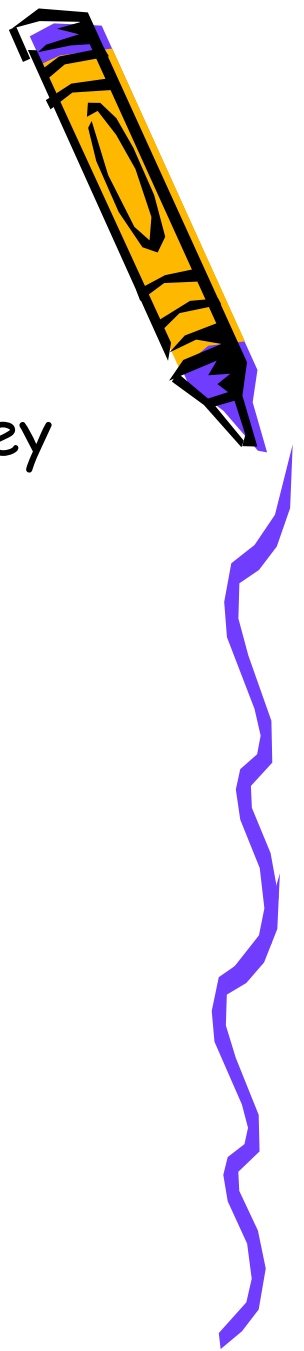


# Lunch

# Homework

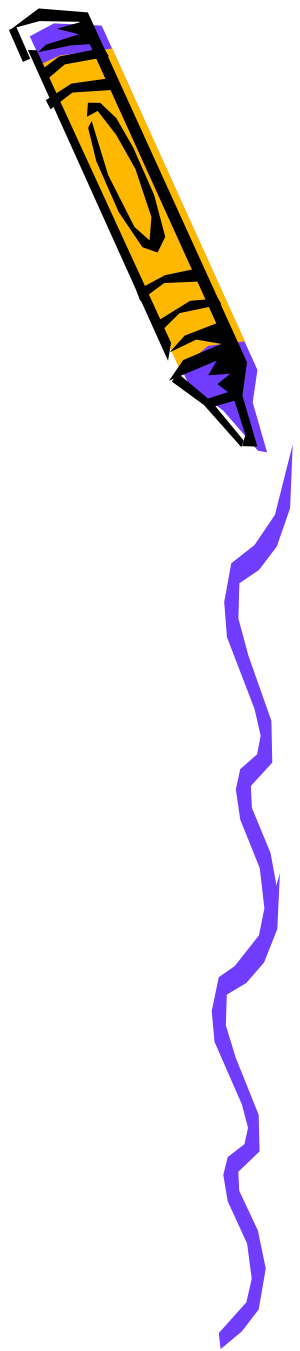
- Please ensure homework is completed by date given as this supports your child's learning.

# Pupil Premium Funding



The school receives an additional **£1,300** for your child if you are in receipt of any of the following benefits:

- **Income Support**
- **Income-based Jobseekers Allowance**
- **Income-related Employment Support Allowance**
- **Child Tax Credit**, (providing you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- **Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit)**
- **Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999**
- **Child Tax Credit**, payable at a higher rate than the family element, i.e. more than £547.50
- **Working Tax Credit, Housing Benefit or Council Tax Support** (not including second adult rebate)

Benefits in school include:

learning support in class

subsidised swimming lessons

end of term treats

free milk (Reception to Year 2)

one-to-one tuition,

cornet lessons (in Year 5)

50% reduction on the cost of trips

50% reduction on cost of school clubs.
